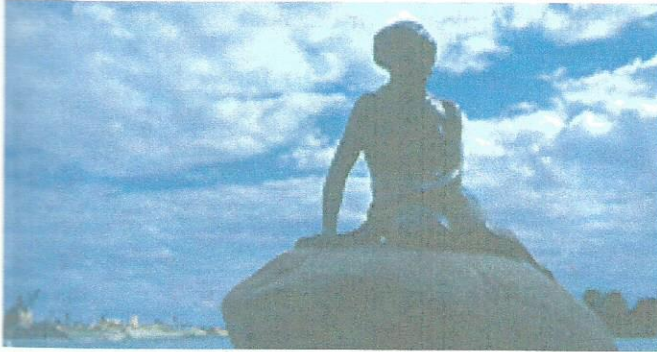


The Little Mermaid

She is perched on a rock at the entrance to the Copenhagen Harbor. In Danish she is called "Langelinie."

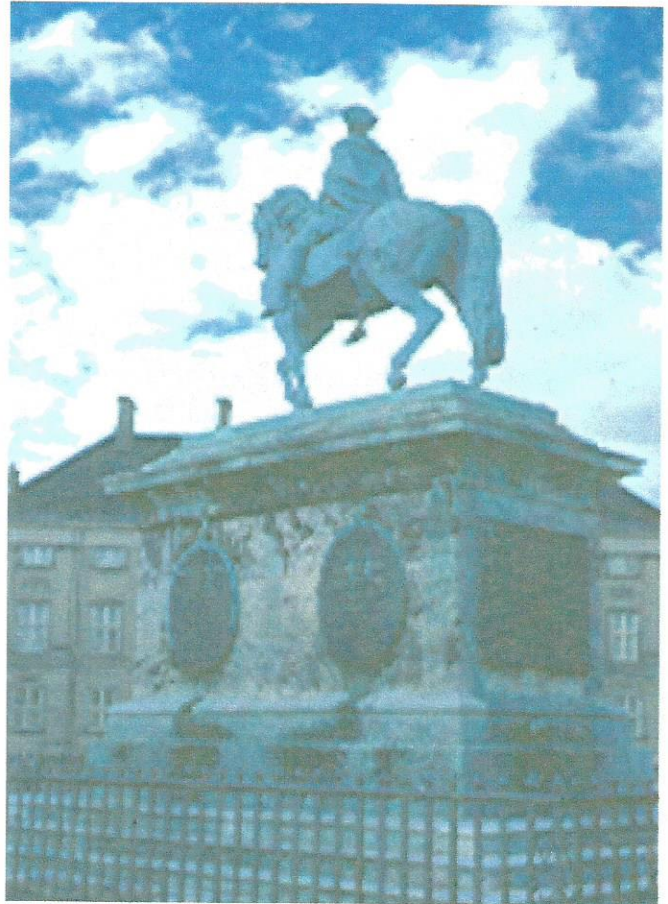


While near the harbor a Hydrofoil went speeding past. It's run to Malmo, Sweden, a distance of approximately 20 miles, takes only 35 minutes.

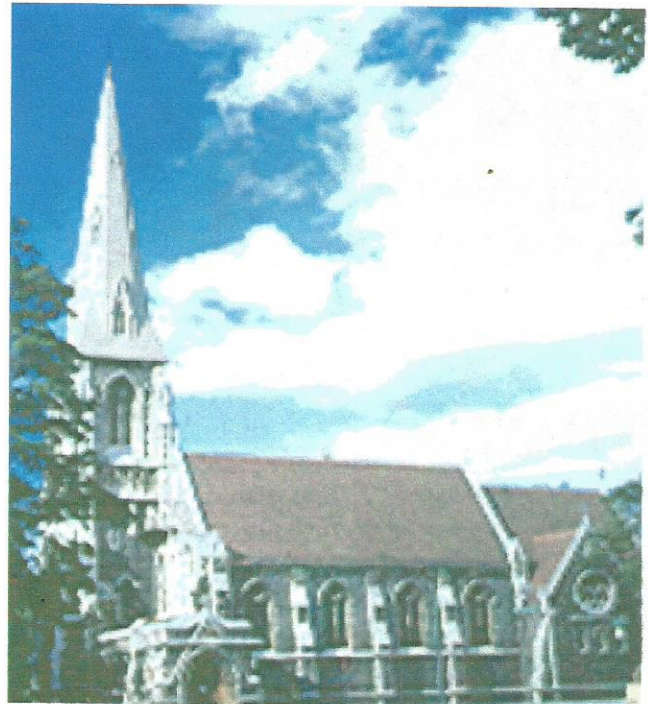
After the city tour we headed for Tivoli Park. It is an amusement park of about 40 acres. It has a little Children's train which made it possible to see the entire park with very little walking. Tivoli is beautifully landscaped with gardens, fountains and scenic walks between 22 restaurants, roller coasters, ferris wheels, and open air theaters.

It was only three blocks back to our hotel. On the way we stopped at the Circus Axeltovej and bought seats for the evening show.
