#1— 9/7-10	Review of course; Career motivations & goals OUTCOMES: Student will describe personal & career goals. Student will investigate their career aptitude.
#2— 9/13-17	Healthcare Professions OUTCOME: Student will describe the characteristics & roles for healthcare professionals.
#3— 9/20-24	Academic and Professional Development Plans (PDP) OUTCOMES: Student will prepare an academic plan and PDP.
#4— 9/27-10/1	Interprofessional Practice (IPP)—Roles & Values OUTCOMES: Student will examine the components of IPP. Student will understand their professional role in relation to other healthcare professions.
#5 & #6— 10/4-15	Interprofessional Practice (IPP)—Communication OUTCOMES: Student will demonstrate effective interpersonal communication skills. Student will describe how culture effects the delivery of healthcare. Student will demonstrate effective IP conflict resolution skills.
#7— 10/18-22	Interprofessional Practice (IPP)—Teamwork OUTCOMES: Student will describe the characteristics of a highly functioning, effective IP team.



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
