Clarinetist Michael Sullivan was born in Manhasset, New York and is a graduate of the Florida State University (BME, DM) and the University of Michigan (MM). As the winner of a German Academic Exchange Service Grant, he pursued post-baccalaureate study at the Staatliche Hochschule fur Musik in Munich, Germany. As first prize winner of the Pro-Mozart Society of Atlanta Concerto Competition, he was awarded a grant to study at the Hochschule fur Musik und Darstellende Kunst (Mozarteum) in Salzburg, Austria where he earned certificates in clarinet and saxophone. He enjoys a diverse career as a clarinet pedagogue, orchestral soloist, and chamber music performer.

Michael Sullivan serves as principal clarinetist with the Ernest Bloch Music Festival in Newport, Oregon, and has served as principal clarinetist with the Phoenix Mainly Mozart Festival, the Flagstaff Festival of the Arts Orchestra, Arizona Opera's Wagner Festival Orchestra, the Flagstaff Symphony Summer Ensemble, and San Juan (CO) Symphony. He has performed as guest artist with the Music Academy of the West, the U.S. Army Field Band, and Chamber Music Sedona. In addition, he has appeared twice as soloist with the Flagstaff Symphony Orchestra, performing concertos by Mozart and Weber. He has been a featured artist at the Appalachian Clarinet Retreat and the Idaho/Montana Clarinet Festival. Dr. Sullivan has presented recitals and master classes at Arizona State University, the University of Arizona, Ohio University, Henderson State University, the University of North Carolina-Greensboro, Eastern Michigan University, Stetson University, and Florida State University as well as at high schools throughout the U.S. He performs regularly with the Arizona Opera and the Phoenix Symphony.

Dr. Sullivan is Associate Professor of Clarinet at the Northern Arizona University School of Music. Prior to teaching appointments include the University of Michigan at the Interlochen Center for the Arts and Pittsburg State University. His principle teachers include Frank Kowalsky, Fred Ormand, Gerd Starkem and Alois Brandhofer. In addition, he performs as fiddler with The Frayed Knots Old Time String Band, an ensemble that performs at folk music festivals and contra dances throughout the Southwestern United States. He serves as Principal Clarinetist for the Carl Fisher Educational Recordings Label and is Co-Artistic Director of the Painted Sky Music Festival, a summer-time chamber music festival in Flagstaff, Arizona.
